

De-escalation from Children's Social Care to Early Intervention Single Assessment (EISA) and Early Intervention Plan Process

Case reaches the point of closure and on-going support is deemed at Tier 3 of the Continuum of Need

Allocated Social Worker:

- Discusses ongoing needs/support with the parent(s) and/or young person and gains signed Tier 3 consent and Privacy consent and send to the EISA team
- Identify Lead Professional at completion of single assessment or Core/CIN Group meeting
- If consent is obtained and Lead Professional identified the Social Worker proceeds to log single assessment with EISA team (details below)
- If Lead Professional not identified Social Worker to forward single assessment with consent to appropriate Early Intervention Panel

Early Intervention Plan/EISA

Consent refused

Record in child's file on CASS

Early Intervention Panel will:-

- Confirm new Lead Professional at panel if required
- Signpost Lead Professional to the EISA team for the signed consent form and supporting documentation
- If a new Lead Professional is identified at panel, they will be informed of the outcome and the EISA team will make contact to provide support and release documentation if required

The new Lead Professional will coordinate the Early Intervention Plan / TAC meetings until all needs have been met, the family can sustain positive changes, the family can move forward without support or consent is withdrawn.

The Lead Professional will also ensure the EISA team receive all documentation after each Early Intervention Plan / TAC meeting.

If consent is withdrawn, the Lead Professional must complete a closure form and send it to the EISA team with an Impact Evaluation form.

If further issues / needs arise through the EISA process further support can be requested from the Early Intervention Panels.
