

## Sexual Exploitation Risk Management Indicator

Risk Level	Behaviours	Required Action	Considerations
<b>LOWER</b>  <b>ONE OR MORE INDICATORS IDENTIFIED</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Regularly coming home late or going missing</li> <li>▪ Experimenting with drugs / alcohol</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Notify MISPER, Police</li> <li>▪ Early assessment of need – CAF</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ No child under 13 can be categorised as LOW</li> <li>▪ No child with a learning disability can be categorised as LOW</li> </ul>
<b>MEDIUM</b>  <b>Any of the above AND ONE OR MORE OF THESE INDICATORS IDENTIFIED</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Overt sexualised dress, sexualised</li> <li>▪ Risk-taking including on the internet</li> <li>▪ Unaccounted for monies or goods, drugs alcohol</li> <li>▪ Using drugs / alcohol increases vulnerability to exploitation</li> <li>▪ Associating with unknown adults or other sexually exploited children</li> <li>▪ Reduced contact with family / friends</li> <li>▪ Sexually transmitted infections</li> <li>▪ Older boy/girlfriend</li> <li>▪ Non school attendee or excluded due to behaviour</li> <li>▪ Staying out overnight, no explanation</li> <li>▪ Breakdown of placements due to behaviour</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Work with child on sexual exploitation risk awareness and staying safe</li> <li>▪ Discuss with line manager</li> <li>▪ Discuss with Duty Social Worker / Referral &amp; Assessment Team</li> <li>▪ Refer to Children’s Social Care</li> </ul>

<p><b>HIGH</b></p> <p><b>Any of the above AND ONE OR MORE OF THESE INDICATORS IDENTIFIED</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Multiple STIs</li> <li>▪ Self harming</li> <li>▪ Getting into cars with unknown or known child sexual exploitative adults</li> <li>▪ Being groomed on internet</li> <li>▪ Clipping (offering to have sex then running on payment)</li> <li>▪ Receiving a reward for recruiting other peers to child sexual exploitation</li> <li>▪ Reports of involvement in child sexual exploitation such as seen in hot spots</li> <li>▪ Child under 13 engaging in penetrative sex with another over 15 years</li> <li>▪ Pattern of street homelessness and staying with an adult believed to be sexually exploiting them</li> <li>▪ Child under 16 meeting different adults for sex</li> <li>▪ Removed from known hot spots / areas of concern by professionals due to child sexual exploitation</li> <li>▪ Being taken to clubs / hotels for sex with adults</li> <li>▪ Being trafficked for sexual exploitation (being taken anywhere within the country)</li> <li>▪ Disclosure of serious physical / sexual assault and then withdrawal</li> <li>▪ Abduction and forced imprisonment</li> <li>▪ Disappearing from the system – no contact with support agencies</li> <li>▪ Under 16 with multiple miscarriages and terminations</li> <li>▪ Indicators of child sexual exploitation in conjunction with chronic alcohol and drug use</li> <li>▪ Indicators of child sexual exploitation alongside serious self harming</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Referral to Children’s Social Care immediately or to Police if in immediate danger</li> </ul>
